Bridge Hand of the Month

It's always frustrating when your opponents insist on sacrificing against your big hands. But it's even more frustrating when you fail to exact the maximum penalty.

And so you find yourself taking some extra time for thought in defending a doubled 4S contract on the fourth board of the final round of the big Sunday Swiss, which your team must win in order to clinch first place.

As dealer, at unfavorable vulnerability, you had no trouble opening 2NT after picking up this hand:

S – K J H – A J 6 3 D – A J 2 C – A Q 9 5

Your LHO passed and your partner, Raoul, bid 3D, a transfer to hearts. But RHO bid 3S, explained as natural, and, over your 4H, LHO bid 4S. Raoul promptly doubled and you, anticipating a big number, decided not to press on to 5H. You led the heart ace, and LHO put down this dummy:

S – Q 5
H – Q 7 2
D – Q 10 7 6 3
C – 8 6 4

You
S – K J
H – A J 6 4
D – A J 2
C – A Q 9 5

East followed to the first heart, but ruffed your heart continuation and led a small spade. You took your king, Raoul following with the four, and East ruffed a third heart and led a second trump to dummy's queen, Raoul echoing with the spade three.

Declarer then led a diamond to his king, your partner contributing the eight, and that's when you went into the tank.

You've taken two tricks already and the diamond ace is a certain third, and the club ace a very likely fourth. So you'll set the contract for sure, but will plus 100 be a good result? Let's see. Your partner holds five trumps and, given the spade bid on your right, you'd probably have guessed the heart queen correctly. That would give you five trump tricks, the spade queen, a spade ruff in your hand, the diamond ace and at least two clubs even if your partner didn't hold the king. That's at least 10 tricks and plus 100 wouldn't even begin to compensate for plus 620.

Raoul's card technique, you know, is impeccable and, given his echo, you can trust that he holds a third trump. It also is a near certainty that his eight of diamonds is the top of a doubleton. But how do you engineer a diamond ruff for him? If you let the king win, declarer

will simply draw Raoul's last trump and lead another diamond, which you'll have to duck. After winning your ace on the third round of diamonds, you'll have to lead a fourth heart and declarer will lose at most only three more tricks, giving you only plus 500.

Finally, you figure out the winning line. You take your diamond ace and return the jack, locking declarer in dummy with no way of drawing Raoul's last trump. Declarer shrugs and leads a club, covering Raoul's ten with the king. You win your ace and give your partner a diamond ruff. He cashes the club jack and leads the three to your queen, declarer following helplessly. Down four, for plus 800!

"Sorry," Raoul says with a wink. "I should have put you in five hearts and spared you all that agony. You'd have made that in your sleep."

You're not sure whether that was a compliment.

(Post-mortem: Your teammates at the other table stayed out of the bidding and West led a diamond against 4H. Your counterpart won the ace, played A-K of trumps, took and repeated the successful club finesse and pitched his losing diamond on the fourth club. Subsequently, he misguessed the spades but wound up with 10 tricks for plus 620. Your team won 4 IMPs after your successful defense. Had you held up the ace of diamonds, you would have lost 4 IMPs. Winning the diamond ace and returning the deuce would have cost 11 IMPs, as would have returning a heart or cashing the club ace. Taking the diamond ace and returning a small club would have allowed declarer to make his contract, costing your team 15 IMPs.)
